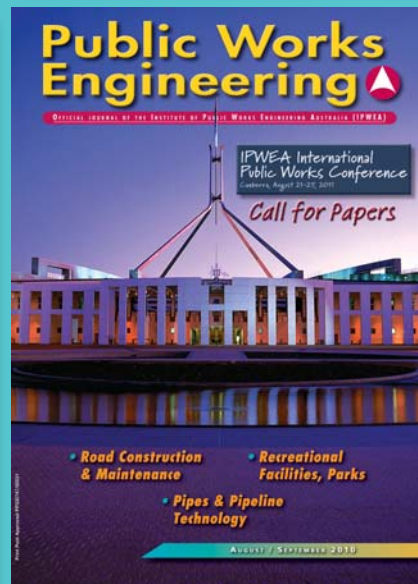
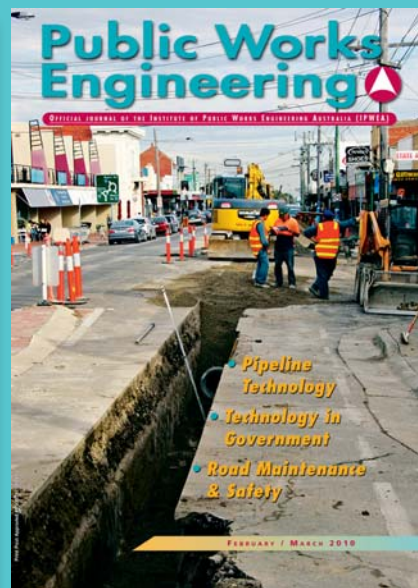
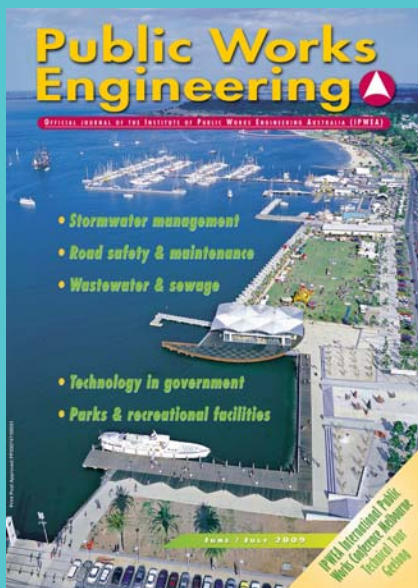

MATERIAL

Artwork can be provided on disk or high-resolution pdfs can be emailed (Adobe Acrobat 8, 7, 6 or 5). Images should be at least 300 dpi and able to be read in Photoshop. Illustrator files should be saved in version 14 or earlier (placed images in Illustrator files should be at least 300 dpi and embedded rather than linked). EPS and TIFF formatted files should be moded as CMYK (not RGB) and should be at least 300dpi. Bleed ads require a minimum 4 mm bleed off the page. It is strongly recommended that type should be kept at least 5 mm from edges of page.
